Kure Memorial Lutheran Church Nursery: You may have noticed we have been having more and more children and youth in worship recently! Our Sunday school is growing and younger families have been attending more regularly. However, there are many of our church and preschool families who either leave their littlest children (age 0-2) at home with mom or dad, or they do not attend very regularly, because it can be a challenge for their children to keep from getting too antsy during an entire hour of worship. So...with a lot of hard work by our Nurture Team, we have developed a plan for nursery care for KMLC! We have 2 young women from Kure Memorial who will share the responsibilities of the lead nursery staff, Chandler Von Cannon and Erica Little, both who have had official background checks. Some of our youth, who are interested, will take turns serving as volunteers helping out Chandler and Erica each week. While we as a congregation encourage families to participate in worship together, parents of very young children (0-2 years old) need to be able to worship as well. By providing a time apart, parents will have the opportunity to focus on worship for some of the service. While their children spend some time in the nursery, parents can also learn more about the flow of the service so they can plan how they can make it be meaningful for their family. The nursery will provide young children a loving place to wiggle and meet other small children at times when worship gets a little long for them. Nursery care will begin on **April 8** in the south preschool classroom...on the same side of the courtyard as the cross!

Here is the process we envision: Ideally or eventually children will begin worship with their families. They will come forward for the children’s talk, and then leave with the rest of the children who wish to go to the nursery or Sunday School. The youth volunteer will help bring the children to the nursery (2/3 year old preschool room...south preschool room). All the children will return to the sanctuary for sharing of the peace through to the end of the service. Some families may choose to have their children begin in the nursery. They know their children best, so the nursery will be staffed from 9:45am until the service has ended. Some families as well may feel the need to bring their children back to the nursery after communion. The nursery staff will return to the nursery after they commune to be available for the children then as well. As time goes on and the children grow, they will be able to spend more and more time in worship with the congregation. Around the time they turn 3, the families will determine when their children transition from the nursery care to Sunday School. Sunday school will continue as it has for the 3 year olds through grade 5! We are very encouraged that this will be a very positive experience for our families as well as for our congregation!



In January of this year the congregation was informed that five members of KMLC would receive financial aid from income from the fund.


In order to continue and expand the stated purpose of the endowment fund, I am encouraging all members and friends of KMLC to consider financially supporting this "fund".

From our Financial Secretary on March Contributions:

We are happy to report that the Tithes and Offerings received for the month of March matched the budgeted needs to support our Mission Plan. As you may be aware, we count on receiving \$3780 per week. (For March this would be $\$3780 \times 4 = \$15,120$.) Our actual contributions were \$15,522.65. Also, this means we completed our first Quarter of 2018 on target for supporting our many ministries. Our special Mid-Week services offerings netted \$1354. The Church Council decided that these funds would be used to support our local Boy and Girl Scouts troops. Once again we thank all of you for your generosity, and for sharing your gifts in support of our common mission.
