

### Book Club:



The Book Club is currently reading *The Lady in Gold: The Extraordinary Tale of Gustav Klimt's Masterpiece, Portrait of Adele Bloch-Bauer* by Anne-Marie O'Connor. The Lady in Gold, considered an unforgettable masterpiece, one of the twentieth century's most recognizable paintings, made headlines all over the world when Ronald Lauder bought it for \$135 million a century after Klimt, the most famous Austrian painter of his time, completed the society portrait. Anne-Marie O'Connor, tells the galvanizing story of the Lady in Gold, Adele Bloch-Bauer, a dazzling Viennese Jewish society figure. She writes of the Nazis confiscating the portrait of Adele from the Bloch-Bauers' grand palais; of the Austrian government putting the painting on display, stripping Adele's Jewish surname from it so that no clues to her identity (nor any hint of her Jewish origins) would be revealed. Nazi officials called the painting, "The Lady in Gold" and proudly exhibited it in Vienna's Baroque Belvedere Palace, consecrated in the 1930s as a Nazi institution. We will be discussing the book on **Thursday, July 19<sup>th</sup>** at 6:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is welcome!

### 2018 North Carolina ELCA Synod Assembly

As your voting representatives, we (Eleanor Lundy and Peter Yandow) attended the Synod Assembly on June 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in Raleigh. The assembly is an annual event when all 197 ELCA congregations in NC can get together, each sending two voting representatives, one male and one female. The assembly is open to all and anyone can attend. This year there were over 500 people registered, including speakers, guests and non-voting attendees.



The assembly was a combination of events and activities that were inspiring, informative, entertaining, and energizing. We began with a worship service on Friday, led by Bishop Tim Smith with songs of praise in many different languages led by the Global Mission Musicians. In his talks at the assembly, Bishop Tim shared the newly adopted call of the NC Synod to:

- Cultivate and celebrate vital congregations that strengthen their relationship with God, nurture their relationship with others and are a life-giving presence in the community.
- Identify, equip and nurture whole and healthy leaders by supporting healthy habits in all areas of life (social, emotional, physical, financial, vocational intellectual and spiritual).
- Embrace and engage in collaboration with our ecumenical and interfaith partners and with the NC Synod agencies, organizations, and with churchwide ministries.
- Proclaim the promise of the resurrection with a prophetic voice and speak truth to power and advocate for the dignity of all God's people.

We heard the annual reports from the many different synod and churchwide agencies and institutions and were amazed to learn of the significant impact the NC Synod has on some of the churchwide agencies. Over \$22 million was contributed to both Lutheran World Relief and Lutheran World Hunger in 2017. **In both cases, over \$1 million of the total was from congregations in the NC Synod.** As Bishop Tim mentioned in his comments, our mission is to follow Micah 6:8 "Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly before the Lord. " We do this not by ensuring that each person gets what he or she deserves, but by ensuring that each person gets what he or she **needs**.

We also learned about the seven mission congregations in NC that are looking for our help and involvement. These ministries are in the start-up phase of their development, leading up to their eventual organization as congregations of the North Carolina Synod of the ELCA. We were asked to consider signing a covenant agreeing to a partnership with these congregations. We will have more information available at a later date.



Part of the purpose of the assembly was to conduct business, and to begin the process the Synod annual budget was voted on and approved. We also elected members to the NC Synod Council, the ELCA Church Council, and ELCA Churchwide Assembly voting members. It was very interesting to vote electronically using our personal phones, and tablets, or those provided at the assembly.

We also discussed and approved four proposed resolutions. Each approved resolution is presented at the ELCA Assembly and includes action items that each congregation is encouraged to consider. The four resolutions are:

- Celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Ordination of Women
- Increase Paid Parental Leave
- Advocacy and Action for Immigration
- Acceptance and Resettlement of Refugees

We were both glad that we attended as your representatives and hope that some of you might consider volunteering to attend the 2019 NC Synod Assembly. It is a worthwhile experience!






