

Costa Rica Micro Loan Project Update: Our micro loan project, that we started 2 years ago has been and continues to be a huge blessing to the communities who have received loans. And it continues to grow! For those of you who are just learning about this ministry of KMLC, during our 2016 visit to Costa Rica, we discussed a plan with them for providing small, interest free loans to single mothers who are trying to grow their own businesses to provide for their families, with the expectation of them paying back according to a predetermined time line. We started with 2 loans, one loan in the amount of \$150 to women in Quitirrisi who make soaps, shampoos and other hygiene items from natural plants and other resources, and one loan in the amount of \$250 to women in Guatuso who make jewelry, hand painted and hand carved crafts as well as other craft items. The women in Quitirrisi have already paid their loan in full and have applied for and received a second loan. The women of Guatuso continue to repay their loan as they are able. The way the program works is that when a loan is paid back, then that money is loaned out to another applicant. When the women repay their loans, they are helping another business person with those funds. So not only do they have the pride of repaying their loan, they have the empowerment of knowing they are helping someone else! We now have a fourth loan out to a family in Quitirrisi who makes lotions and shampoos. A fifth loan is being applied for by women artisans from La Carpio who make embroidered cloth and other art work. Funds that have been repaid by the women of Guatuso will be utilized for this fifth loan. Of the 5 loans, KMLC has only financially provided 3 of them. The other two are from repayments! It is an exciting project that has been very successful. A big part of this program's success is our friend, contact person and tour guide, Rodolfo Mena, who is on staff with the Lutheran Church of Costa Rica. Rodolfo manages the funds, makes the contacts, reviews the applications and facilitates the project on the ground in Costa Rica for us! Thanks Rodolfo! Thank you all for your support of this unique ministry! If you have any questions about this project, please contact Pastor Dan...he can discuss this further with you as well as provide other contact people for you to talk with.

Reminder about our staffed nursery: Do you know any families with children through age 2, who would love to come to worship here at Kure Memorial, but are hesitant because they have young children and would like a safe place for them to play when they get a little active during worship? Or maybe parents who are slowly trying to introduce their children to experiencing our worship experience? Please invite them to join us on Sunday mornings and let them know that we now have a staffed nursery, for families just like them! Their children can spend as little or as much time in the nursery as they need to. We love to have all of our family members worshiping with us, but sometimes that may not be possible. The nursery is located in the south preschool room. Chandler Von Cannon and Erica Little are our nursery staff, along with a youth helper who will assist as needed.


