

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month for the ELCA.

One in three women and one in four men have been victims of [some form of] domestic violence by an intimate partner within their lifetime, according to the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence (NCADV). We have been asked as members of the ELCA to educate ourselves about the signs of domestic abuse and violence and the services available in our community. Some suggestions:

- Post information for local domestic violence hotlines and other hotlines in church restrooms, on bulletin boards, in church newsletters and in other publications.
- Assist people in crisis by connecting them with agencies, professionals, and resources, offering financial support to local domestic abuse and violence shelters and donating items for their “needs list”, such as personal hygiene items, food, clothing, furniture, toys, quilts, and attending their events and fundraisers.
- Volunteer at a local domestic abuse and violence shelter.
- Make every ELCA congregation, where possible, a safe space for victims of domestic abuse and violence, and make it known.
- Further educate ourselves about domestic abuse and violence, by consulting [ELCA Justice for Women](#), [Faith Trust Institute](#), [National Coalition Against Domestic Violence Children’s Defense Fund](#).
- Pray for all victims of domestic violence.

Domestic violence is a “pattern of abusive behaviors—including physical, sexual, and psychological attacks as well as economic coercion—used by one intimate partner against another (adult or adolescent) to gain, maintain, or regain power and control in the relationship,” reports the Domestic Violence Awareness Project. “Batterers use of a range of tactics to frighten, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, blame, often injure, and sometimes kill a current or former intimate partner.”

The Power & Control diagram, from the National Domestic Violence Hotline, is a tool in understanding the overall pattern of abusive and violent behaviors, which are used by a batterer to establish and maintain control over their partner.

From our Financial Secretary on September Contributions:

For the month of September we were counting on receiving \$18,800 to support our Mission Plan. (\$3760 x 5 weeks). Our actual Tithes and Offerings were \$15,589, about \$3100 below our projected needs. We are grateful for all of you who have contributed in many ways this past month, giving of your time, strength and resources to help those impacted by Hurricane Florence. Despite the hardships and upheavals folks experienced, the generosity of many has been a blessing. Our Rice Bowl offering this month, for Lutheran Disaster Relief in the Carolina's, brought in over \$960.00 - a real sign of our commitment to help our neighbors.

From Celeste, our Preschool Director: "Thank you, thank you, thank you! The staff and students of Kure Memorial Lutheran Preschool are sincerely grateful for the financial gifts you have bestowed upon us to begin our school year!

- The \$264 collected through the special rice bowl offering has enabled the preschool to purchase necessary supplies to promote the education of the children and families we serve.
- In addition, the preschool staff, is extremely thankful to the church for supporting our teachers during/after the storm. The supplemental pay for some hours that we were unable to work was a huge blessing for the 7 staff members.

Thank you again for enabling the preschool to minister to the families in our community! We love partnering with you!"

(Note from Pastor Dan: The wake of Hurricane Florence has been very difficult on many families in our community, including our preschool teachers! Our preschool is a huge blessing to our church community and we are so blessed to have an amazing teaching staff that makes our preschool one of the most sought after programs in the area! In response to the financial stress our teachers are experiencing because school was not in session for 2 weeks because of the storm, as part of our generosity as a congregation, Kure Memorial helped to supplement their pay for part of that time they were unable to work. Our church continues to be a blessing to others!)
