It’s for us. It’s important for us because it strengthens our relationship with God as well as reminding us that we are dependent on God for everything that we have and everything that we are.

May the blessings of this Thanksgiving be with you as you “give thanks” to God for his many blessings in our lives...and not just on Thanksgiving Day...but every day throughout the year!

KMLC CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES: Your church council met Monday, Oct. 15, and discussed many topics including assistance for members who have been impacted by Hurricane Florence. Please contact Pastor Dan if you have had damage to your home and would like some help, either physical or financial. Other items on the agenda included:

- Proposed Mission Plan for 2019 will be available to congregation members at Sunday services beginning November 18.
- **Part 1 of our annual Congregational Meeting to vote on the proposed 2019 Mission Plan and to vote for council members for 2019 will be held after church service on December 9.**
- **Part 2 of Congregational Meeting will be after church service on January 20, 2019.**
- Advent services begin Wednesday, December 5 at 7:00 pm.
- Church Decorating Day will be after church service on Sunday, December 2 with a lunch for decorators after church and Fellowship Hall are decorated.
- KMLC Pre-school Christmas Program will be during the Advent service on Wednesday, December 12 with a supper for Pre-school children, parents, and staff at 6:00.
- Blue Christmas service of healing and hope will be held on Thursday, December 20.
- Replacement of five doors (2 office doors and 3 classroom doors) was approved and should be finished before Christmas. The remaining four doors on the south side of the classroom/office wing will be done in 2019.

Grant from the Michael Peeler/Virginia Casey Endowment: The Michael Peeler/Virginia Casey Endowment is an endowment through the North Carolina Synod that is available for congregations and organizations who are involved in outreach ministries in their communities. Back in June, KMLC applied for a grant to expand our Sunday Lunch Ministry, so that we would be able to do more for those in need...adding to our congregational commitment! Our grant application was approved and we received a grant for \$5000 to expand our ministry to provide more healthy choices for those we serve! So in addition to the sandwiches, fruit, chips and cookies we provide, we are now providing tuna packets, fruit cups and condiments to go along with the lunches. Our plan was also to increase the number of lunches each week...although as a result of the storm, many of our regular guests evacuated and haven't returned. We have had several new people seek us out, so we know the need still exists, now more than ever. Please keep this ministry in your prayers! 
Daylight Saving Time Ends! Mark your calendar on **Sunday, November 4th** and don't forget to fall back and set your clock's back one hour!

Book Club



We will meet on **Tuesday, November 13th**, at **6:00 PM** in the Fellowship Hall. Our latest book, *Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders*, by David Grann, is a twisting, haunting true-life murder mystery about one of the most monstrous crimes in American history. In the 1920s, the richest people per capita in the world were members of the Osage Nation in Oklahoma. After oil was discovered beneath their land, the Osage rode in chauffeured automobiles, built mansions, and sent their children to study in Europe.

Then, one by one, the Osage began to be killed off. The family of an Osage woman, Mollie Burkhart, became a prime target. One of her relatives was shot. Another was poisoned. And it was just the beginning, as more and more Osage were dying under mysterious circumstances, and many of those who dared to investigate the killings were themselves murdered.

As the death toll rose, the newly created FBI took up the case, and the young director, J. Edgar Hoover, turned to a former Texas Ranger named Tom White to try to unravel the mystery. White put together an undercover team, including a Native American agent who infiltrated the region, and together with the Osage began to expose one of the most chilling conspiracies in American history (review from the publisher).
