The Season of Lent is in full swing and will be coming to a close at the end of the month as we will arrive at Palm Sunday and then move into Holy Week.

Here is a peak into what that week will have in store for us!

**Palm/Passion Sunday:** We will experience the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem as we begin with a festive procession with palm branches from the courtyard and into and around the sanctuary singing joyfully “All Glory, Laud and Honor”! We will then transition into the sadness of his death as we watch his journey to the cross through the streets of Jerusalem with the singing of Via Dolorosa!

We will then continue our journey through Holy Week: On **Maundy Thursday** we will experience the Last Supper and Stripping of the Altar in preparation for our **Good Friday Tenbrae Service**, when we experience the seven last words from the cross before Jesus died as the sanctuary is darkened. On **Saturday** we will gather for the **Easter Vigil**, which is a service that commemorates Jesus passing from death to life. We will begin in the courtyard surrounding a fire, light the Pascal candle symbolizing the presence of the Resurrected Christ and with all those gathered, candles in hand, we will process into the sanctuary where, through prayers and readings we will transition God’s saving acts throughout history in the Old Testament into celebrating the resurrection of Christ! We will also have five baptisms and two first communions on that day!

Easter morning begins with the **Community Sunrise Service** at Ocean Front Park in Kure Beach, beginning at 6:45am hosted by Kure Memorial and the Kure Beach First Baptist Church. Our **Easter worship celebration** here at Kure Memorial begins at 10am in the sanctuary following the annual Easter Breakfast and egg hunt for the children. You are invited to participate in all of our services as we journey through this most Holy time of year! We hope you will worship with us!

### From our Financial Secretary:

As we come to the end of the first quarter of 2019 and embark on our second quarter, I wanted to share some more detailed information with you. I also invite you to reflect on where we are so far. When we voted to approve the Mission Plan for 2019, we noted and agreed to the fact that we would need \$4200 a week to support our various ministries. For the first quarter of 2019, our Tithes and Offerings have not met this goal. In fact, for the twelve Sundays of this quarter, our weekly Tithes and Offerings averaged \$3,528 a week, ranging from a low of \$2,233 to a high of \$4,163. (Only one week was above \$4000).

Our attendance this quarter has varied greatly as well. While over 70 families have made contributions January through March, only 35 families on average contribute each week. The many ministries supported by our Mission Plan continue week in and week out and our subsequent expenses are consistent. We are grateful for all of you who contribute generously in an on-going way. We thank those of you who give "make-up" contributions for the Sundays you are unable to attend. We invite you to consider making your Tithes and Offerings a part of your family's weekly or monthly budget. Working together, we can ensure that the Tithes and Offerings given to Kure Memorial Lutheran Church will sustain our many ministries throughout the year.

The end of Income Tax time is here! Certified tax preparers will be available at the Senior Resource Center on Shipyard and at the Carolina Beach Senior Center. Remember this year, you will need to bring your Social Security card - because Medicare cards no longer have your Social Security number. This year the senior centers will not be able to assist residents who experienced catastrophic loss due to Hurricane Florence, in their income tax preparation. The IRS has deemed catastrophic loss as out of their scope and recommend that such residents seek the services of a professional preparer, such as a CPA.
