This past spring you probably all noticed the beach re-nourishment project going on! Did you ever watch them do it? It's actually a pretty amazing process...that of building up and reforming the beaches after they've been worn down and washed away through the changing of tides and storms and hurricanes...and just normal wear and tear, right? The beaches around here especially needed it after Hurricane Florence came through last fall.

There is a handicap beach access at the end of Ave. L...just down from the church. That's the access Chris and I normally use. We went down to the beach the Wednesday after the storm...after we got back from Raleigh. At the end of the handicap ramp access to the beach...there was a drop down to the sand of about 2 feet. It was unbelievable...

So the crews came in this spring and brought in more sand, and they build it up and sculpted it and molded it and shaped it into what the beach is supposed to be.

This image came to mind recently as I thought about this passage from Isaiah. Because it's a great image of us if you think about it. God created us so intricately and meticulously. Perfect in God's eyes. But then over time we too get worn down through the storms of our lives...through the difficulties and challenges we experience...and the winds that seem to...to blow us around so we can't get our bearings.

And maybe there are times when we feel like we are getting washed away with little or no hope. But then through God's grace, through his mercy, his compassion, his gentleness, his comfort and his guidance... he reshapes us...he reforms us, he renews us and re-nourishes us to be the people he calls us to be.

And then...as nature takes its course, the cycle happens again, right? We get worn down, and blown around and need to be reshaped and re-nourished once again...And God continues to mold us and shape us and renew us.

I think this is an awesome image Isaiah 64, of God as the potter and us as the clay...as he continues to mold us and shape us into the people he created us to be.
