Ash Wednesday. We begin the season of Lent each year by coming to church to worship and to receive ashes on our foreheads in the image of a cross, with these words: “For you are dust and to dust you shall return.”

Although it is a wonderful and meaningful tradition that many of us have experienced over the years or are looking forward to experiencing for the first time, we may be wondering, “Why do we do this anyway?”

The words above from the book of Genesis, chapter 3, are words from God to Adam and Eve after they sinned. And when that happened, sin entered the world, not just for them, but for every generation of Adam ever since...including us! And God’s punishment...was death.

Now, let’s look back to Genesis 2:7, “Then the Lord God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.” Here, we read that Adam was formed from the dust of earth, which is what God is reminding him of when he says, “For dust you are.” And then, as a result of sin being introduced to the world, death was certain; God continues, “and to dust you will return.”

And so, we begin our Lenten journey, being reminded of our sinfulness and the death that comes as a result of it, but at the same time, we also share in the promise that we proclaim in what is referred to as the Mystery of Faith; “Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.” This is the promise that Jesus came to die for us, to save us from our sins and to give us the gift of eternal life, so that death would no longer have a hold on us! It’s the promise that because of what Jesus did for us, we are forgiven and made new!

So, on Ash Wednesday as ashes are placed on our foreheads making the sign of the cross, we will hear the words, “For you are dust and to dust you shall return”. These words are to remind us of our sinfulness; but at the same time, they set the stage for us as we begin our Lenten journey, where the good news of Christ’s death and resurrection will unfold before us as we experience in new ways the salvation of our Lord Jesus throughout this season of Lent, Holy Week and the glorious Resurrection of Jesus on Easter morning!

Blessings to you all as we embark on this most Holy season! I pray that we will experience together in new ways the power of Jesus in our lives throughout our Lenten journey this year!

We will be receiving more information from her about her needs, which will be shared with you once we get them. The loan she requested is \$100. At this time, it appears that these funds are currently available from loans that were repaid by previous recipients! How exciting!!! This makes the seventh loan provided and Kure Memorial only provided for three of them! This means that through repaid funds from those three interest-free loans, this micro loan program has been able to provide additional loans to four new applicants. What a blessing this project has been, that began in 2016!

From the Financial Secretary:

We start 2020 with a new Mission Plan needing weekly contributions of \$4368.50 to support our many ministries and programs. This means that for January, we were hoping to receive \$17,474 in Tithes and Offerings. Our actual contributions this month were \$24,288, which included \$6850 given as total yearly pledges by two families. We thank everyone for their generosity in helping us start the year on a positive note.

New Hanover County Volunteer Income Tax Assistance is serving New Hanover County for FREE Tax Preparation beginning January 31st, 2020 at the Senior Center and on February 3rd, 2020 for all other locations.

What to Bring

1. Picture ID, social security card, and date of birth for self and all other dependents
2. Wage statements (W-2's and 1099) from all employers
3. Pension, social security, and/or Railroad Retirement statements
4. Interest, dividend, and Brokerage statements
5. For itemized deductions: Out of pocket costs for health insurance and medical expenses/Home mortgage interest and real estate property taxes paid in 2019/charitable contributions
6. Your 2019 tax return. Bringing it may save you time and money
7. Any other tax documents related to 2019. Checking Account routing and account numbers for direct deposit
8. All ACA (Obamacare) statements (1095-A, 1095-B, 1095-C) that you received. If you purchased insurance from the Marketplace, you MUST have your form 1095-A in order to do your tax return.

What we can do and What we cannot do

We CANNOT do past year returns or amended returns until March 1st, 2020. Limited to 2018, 2017, and 2016 only.

We CANNOT do rental income.

We CANNOT do Clergy returns.

We CANNOT do casualty or theft losses.

We CANNOT do returns with inherited property/stock with the date of death in 2010.

We CANNOT do returns for any other states.

We will do self-employment, with the following restrictions: Sole proprietor, no employees, no inventory, standard mileage rate only, no home office deduction, and no depreciation.

Schedule C with expenses up to \$25,000.00 and cannot show a loss.

We will do SIMPLE K-1's as follows: K-1 shows only interest, dividends and qualified dividends, capital gains, and royalties.

We will do North Carolina returns

Good Shepherd Center Fund Raiser - Bowling for Backpacks

One of the area ministries we support is the Good Shepherd Center which provides services for the hungry, homeless and underserved in our community. When guests arrive, they are given a new adult backpacks filled with some needed items such as socks, underwear, spray deodorant, bike locks, wash cloths and a wallet.

There is an upcoming event to support this ministry - it's called "Bowling for Backpacks". We invite you to participate in this event in a variety of ways:

1. Help us donate filled backpacks. We will be collecting new adult backpacks and needed filler items such as new men's socks, men's underwear, spray deodorant, wallets and wash cloths. Several groups in our Congregation are encouraged to fill a backpack or two. (Bookclubs, Men's group, Pre-school, etc.) Families may want to fill and donate a back pack. Individuals are invited to bring in needed items. We will have a bin in the narthex to collect these items. We need all donations by Sunday March 1st.
2. Sign up to bowling in the March 6th event - donation is \$25 a person or \$100 for a team of four. A flyer is provided for you with further information.
