And it does so much for others as we work to bring a glimpse of the kingdom of heaven into the world around us.

**Sunday morning worship and “Re-gathering” Plan for Kure Memorial:** For three months now, we have been worshiping via Facebook Live and Zoom and continue to do so. We are very encouraged and thankful for the response, dedication and patience of all of you as we wait to come back together for worship! We have had a few folks ask when we will be gathering worship together again. As I have previously shared, we are following the North Carolina Synod's recommendation to wait until the state of North Carolina gives the green light to move to “Phase 3” of their re-opening plan. We have many people who are in the higher risk

categories of age and health issues and our entire church council wants to be as caring and careful as we can be in light of the virus that is turning this world upside down! Tim Smith, the Bishop of the North Carolina Synod put it this way, when considering when to recommend churches to regather: “in the words of Paul in 1 Corinthians: ‘*All things are lawful*’, but not all things are beneficial.” I think this is a great way to think about the situation we are in from a scriptural perspective as we seek to love and care for one another in the midst of the health crisis we are facing. So...although not the same, we will continue to bring you worship each Sunday via webcast as well as offering our “live” Wednesday beach service, where we can spread out and typically have the whole beach to ourselves! In the meantime, we will keep you posted as we continue walking through this process together.

\*\*Over the last couple of months, the worship team and council came up with guidelines for our church to re-gather based on recommendations from the ELCA as well as other resources from the health field. We also considered our specific context of worship and how this will look for us as a community of faith. You will find these guidelines at the end of the newsletter entitled:

**“Re-gathering” Guidelines for Worship.** The goal of this document is for Kure Memorial to provide the most faithful, joyful and meaningful worship experience for everyone in the midst of a very difficult situation! I am so grateful for the team (worship team and council) who worked so hard to put this together. It was not an easy task and we wrestled with some very difficult and challenging questions! But in the end, I think we came up with something that will be very meaningful and safe. So, when we get the go-ahead to begin gathering for worship again...we are ready to go! Thank you for your patience during this time!



**Beach Worship!** Our long-awaited beach worship service is off and running! We have a full slate of musicians for the summer already and are ready to go! We feel comfortable gathering on the beach, since we can spread out as far as we need to, to keep a safe distance. So, join us at 7pm on Wednesdays, out on the beach at the end of Avenue F in Kure Beach, about a half mile south of the stoplight! Bring your beach chair, beach towel or blanket and

join us for a refreshing, casual time of worship together.

**Most things continue to be put on hold for the month of July!** However, we are still collecting food for the *Help Center* as well as food and other supplies for *the Good Shepherd Homeless Shelter* in Wilmington. Both are in dire situations because churches aren't meeting and providing assistance they typically do. Here is the list of items for *Good Shepherd*: *milk, ground coffee, sugar, sliced bread, salt and pepper, bottled water, hand sanitizer, rubber flip flops, Gatorade, puzzles and games, and adult coloring books.* You can drop items off at the church for both organizations. Or if you prefer not to go out, but would like to donate something, you can leave it on your doorstep and someone will come and pick it up to get it where it needs to go! Please don't hesitate to contact the church office if that is the case and we would love to help out!

**Out of the Pews:** Our ministry for those ages 40ish to 60ish, will be gathering on Saturday, July 18 beginning at 6:30pm. We haven't decided if it will be via Zoom again, or if we will be gathering outside somewhere, where we can spread out! Mark your calendars and we'll keep you posted. **Coordinator of Youth and Family Ministry update:** As you may remember, back in February, Erica Little, our Coordinator of Youth and Family Ministry resigned from her position. There has been a team of folks reviewing our needs as a congregation and updating the ministry description so we can begin the hiring process. We are in the process of discussing how that will look in the midst of the continued uncertainty of the virus situation we find ourselves in. We will keep you posted as things unfold!

**From the Financial Secretary:** During the month of June, we received contributions from 46 different families. Three families are using the Paypal on-line contribution format and several others are having their banks send the checks directly to the Church. We thank all of you who continue to go out of your way to make sure that Kure Memorial receives your tithes and offerings. Your support has truly helped us to continue to live out our Mission Plan.

Our Mission Plan for the month of June relied on our receiving \$ 17,474 in tithes and offerings. The actual contribution number was \$15, 848. This reflects a shortfall of \$1,626, about 10% less than we need. We want you to know that during this time of COVID-19, we are grateful that the Kure Memorial faith community members continue to share their resources so generously.

Remember that if you and your family are financially struggling at this time, that we have a COVID Cares fund to provide some assistance. Speak to Pastor Dan or Todd Vought for more information.

In the next few weeks, we will be mailing out the Quarterly Contribution statements to our members and active non-members.

# VITA Tax Information from the Senior Resource Center

Last chance to file your 2019 taxes. The Vita Programs will be ending on July 15th. Read below for more information.

The Volunteer Tax Assistance Programs at both the Senior Resource Center and the Carolina Beach location will resume serving the community with our Free Income Tax Service until **JULY 15<sup>TH</sup>**. Due to COVID-10 restrictions, we have implemented a process to minimize contact between taxpayers and VITA staff at each location and we are serving the public with a drop off service only.

- We are only preparing 2019 taxes.
- At the Senior Resource Center, you must have an appointment to drop off your documents. You will then drop off your documents and leave. There is no waiting to meet with a tax preparer.
- In addition to bringing your documents and required information, you must have completed two forms at the drop off: The Virtual Taxpayer Consent Form AND the Intake Interview Sheet. (These forms are available at each location.)
- A certified tax preparer will call you to verify certain information and review your return with you.
- you will be notified to return to the site to pick up your completed return and paperwork after it has been completed and reviewed.

## **“Re-gathering” Guidelines for Worship**

Our Worship Team met on May 17, 2020 to discuss “re-gathering” options for our Sunday worship life together. The date of “re-gathering” as a congregation will be based on guidelines for gatherings from the state’s phasing plan as well as recommendations from the North Carolina Synod. As of May 22, the date of re-gathering for Sunday worship is still uncertain. However, as we plan for that time when we are able, we took into account documents made available by the synod which had some great questions for consideration! Along with input from our church council, here is what we came up with:

1. The plan is to worship outdoors in the lawn area between the church and the parsonage, where people can bring their own chairs and spread out as much as they need to. From what I last saw, the state has not given a maximum number for outdoor worship gatherings as long as people maintain a safe distance.
  - a. Everyone will be reminded to keep appropriate distance between themselves and the next individual/family unit. After much discussion, we decided it was not necessary to “micro-manage” everyone and paint lines on the ground...most likely we will have too many different size family units for that to be effective.
  - b. Face coverings will be required by staff and the congregation.
  - c. We will encourage those in the “high risk” categories of age and health to stay home and worship online, like we’ve been doing, for the time being.
  - d. Some plastic chairs from the fellowship hall will be provided for those who don’t bring their own.
    - i. Nick will sanitize the chairs both before the service and after the service.
    - ii. Rubber or plastic gloves will be used to handle the chairs.
  - e. The keyboard will be set up in the gazebo, as it is for other outdoor services.
  - f. The portable sound system will be set up each week.
2. We will continue to livestream our services on Facebook Live and Zoom as we have been as both are great options for those either wishing to or needing to stay home, as well as for those out of town.
3. Ushers will be required to wear face coverings and gloves. Bulletins will be on a table for pick up.
4. The sanctuary, with air conditioning, will be open for those who choose to come to worship, but because of health issues can’t be in the heat or sun for extended periods of time.
  - a. Proper spacing in the sanctuary will be encouraged, which, from our discussion means 2 people per pew (either 1 couple or 1 person on each side) or 1 family per pew, seated every other pew. This guideline will be written on a newsprint pad as folks enter the sanctuary as well as a note posted on each pew. Ushers will also be asked to remind them of this.
  - b. Pews will be roped off that are not to be used.

- c. We will utilize the sound system in the sanctuary so the service can be heard inside. Microphones will be used outside by participants to project the service.
  - d. A computer, projector and screen in the sanctuary to live stream the service through the projector and onto the screen for those in the sanctuary.
  - e. The sanctuary will be sanitized before worship each week and then following the service.
5. The children's message will work by asking the children to stay at their places and the Pastor will talk from up front.
  6. A table will be set up with a receptacle placed on it for everyone to put their offering envelopes in as they either arrive or leave. No offering plates will be passed.
  7. Passing of the peace will be done verbally only, with people staying in their places with proper distance, to minimize milling around.
  8. Plans for Holy Communion are as follows: (which elements personal contact and social distancing)
    - a. We will use wafers rather than bread
    - b. Cups will be prefilled with wine or grape juice. The person preparing communion will be appropriately clothed with face covering and gloves. The communion assistant will be wearing face covering and gloves.
    - c. A table will be set up with the cups of wine/grape juice.
    - d. A second table will be used for the communion ritual at the proper distancing.
    - e. Each individual, couple or family unit will come forward one family grouping at a time and will wait at a predetermined distance from the communion table.
    - f. Wafers will be placed on top of the cup for each person in that particular group before they come forward.
    - g. The communion assistant will place the proper number of communion elements on the communion table.
    - h. When they come forward, they will take their cup with the wafer on top. I/communion assistant will be standing back to say the words, "The body of Christ given for you" and "The blood of Christ shed for you." They will eat the wafer and drink the wine/grape juice. Those in the sanctuary will be asked if they wish to participate in communion following this procedure. A waste basket will be available as people return to their seats while the next person/family unit comes forward. Still thinking through the circulation pattern!
      - i. It may be easier to actually see how this will work, rather than trying to describe it!
      - ii. The question was asked, "what happens to the wafer if it's windy?" Great question! The wafer sits down a little bit into the cup, so it most likely will stay. I tried it with a breeze and it seemed to work well. We'll have to wait and see!

9. In the event of rain on a Sunday morning, “in-person” worship will be canceled and we will worship through our Facebook Live and Zoom livestreaming like we do now.

Of course, this all is dependent upon any further recommendations from the state of North Carolina and the North Carolina Synod!

We discussed the question, “How will we honor and celebrate ways that we have already been worshipping as a congregation?” The suggestion was made to invite everyone to take a picture or a very short video clip of them “worshipping at home”. These photos/videos will be put together into a video to be shared with the congregation thanking them for their dedication and persistence during this unusual time together! We just need to find someone to put it all together!

#### Added notes

- Guideline signage will be posted at appropriate places.
- Special music allowed outdoors.
- Unison speaking (e.g. Psalm response, Creed, Lord’s Prayer) allowed.
- Baskets for bulletin disposal.
- Bathroom sanitized prior to service and sanitation products provided in bathrooms.
- Fellowship doors to be sanitized by ushers as necessary.
  - A few extra face coverings will be available if needed.
