Lavender. Grapes. Violets. Raisins. Barney. Plums. The paraments (those colorful clothes on the altar and lectern) during the season of Lent...make sure you pay attention to that detail during our livestream services on Sundays! Okay, so here's my trivia question: What do all these things have in common? I'll pause for a few moments so you can think about it. Okay, ready? I know...all these things seem to be quite unrelated don't they? Here's the answer: They all contain the color purple! How many of you answered correctly?

Now, the color purple just happens to be one of my favorite colors! Because it seems to give life and energy to things. Its beauty is a contrast to the most other colors around it. It seems so cheery and bright! Plus...I just think it's just really pretty!

However, when we think about the season of Lent, the color purple is more than just a pretty color to beautify the sanctuary. It has a much deeper meaning. The color purple represents two images. First, the color purple represents mourning and repentance, symbolizing Jesus' pain, suffering and death as well as our reflecting on our sinfulness and our need for repentance and a change of heart, turning away from our sin that seeks healing and forgiveness.

But that's not all. The color purple is also a color of royalty and to welcome the coming of a king! The color purple represents Jesus' kingship and his reign over us. It represents his glory bringing us forgiveness and his victory over death.

So although Lent is a time of reflection, a time of remembering our sinfulness and what Jesus has done for us through his suffering and death on the cross, it is also a time of reflecting on his glory, his victory of sin and death, and his kingship over creation.

So as we enter into this season of Lent, may we experience this most Holy season as people of the resurrection...reflecting on the suffering and death of our Lord who brings us forgiveness, but always rejoicing in the, "the rest of the story" as Paul Harvey used to say...which is the resurrection on Easter Morning! God's richest blessings for a meaningful Lenten journey!

Ash Wednesday and Lent: Wait a minute. Didn't we just celebrate Christmas? Yes, we did! And Ash Wednesday is right around the corner! February 17 to be exact! We will have worship on Ash Wednesday at 7pm. It will be livestreamed, so we hope you will tune into our worship that evening, either on Zoom or on Facebook Live, as we begin the season of Lent. Since, because of Covid, we cannot meet for our dinner church events again this year, we will be providing a bible study series via Zoom each Wednesday evening through Lent, entitled: *"The Way; Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus"*. It is written by Adam Hamilton, a Methodist pastor, who takes us to the Holy Land and the location of Jesus' life and ministry. Each study will include a short, 10 minute video clip, along with scripture and conversation. Costa Rica Shoe Challenge! The traveling Costa Rica Mission Team is preparing again, to travel to Costa Rica this summer...after our trip was cancelled last year! **Now, here is the challenge: We are challenging you to help us raise money for our trip and at the same time invest in small business owners in developing nations! All without giving any money!** We are challenging you to help us collect gently worn or new shoes! That’s it! Clean out your closets! Ask your friends and neighbors to clean out their closets! And give us the shoes you will be giving away anyway! For each pair of shoes donated, we as a mission team benefit by earning money. The shoes are given to small business owners who sell the

shoes at reasonable prices in their communities...so the business owner benefits from the shoes as well as their customer who was able to buy them! So...just by donating your shoes...you help 3 different groups of people! The challenge begins in February and will conclude in April! Our goal is to collect 2500 pairs of shoes! Yes, it sounds like a lot! But with your help, we are sure to reach our goal! We have already started with this project last year...so we already have a head start! We are working with an organization called, “Funds2Orgs”. Be sure to check out their website: www.funds2orgs.com. One of the great things about this, is that it helps small business owners in developing nations, much like the micro loan project Kure Memorial started in Costa Rica 5 years ago! **So...let the challenge begin!** Begin collecting your shoes and we will be providing more information to you very soon!

Annual Polar Plunge for Special Olympics! For the last 5 years, Kure Memorial has had one of the best/largest teams for the annual Polar Plunge! It has been a great event for our church family! This year, however, New Hanover County Special Olympics has announced they are cancelling the “in-person” Polar Plunge this year, due to continuing COVID-19 restrictions. They are hosting the Polar Plunge “virtually”, which means they are inviting/encouraging folks to still register and either do the plunge, the 5K run or the 1 mile walk on their own...or with family or friends! 
Re-Gathering for Sunday morning worship at Kure Memorial:

We continue gathering at our normal time of 10am each Sunday outside in the lawn area near the gazebo, at least on days when it is warm enough to do so and it’s not raining! Please bring a lawn chair, your trusty face mask/covering and join us for worship! **For those with health concerns or if it’s too cold or windy, we also have seating available in the sanctuary** with the appropriate distancing. We are projecting the service via Zoom onto a screen for you to view the service. Sound from outside is brought directly into the sanctuary so you can follow along! For those who are out of town or either wish to or need to stay home to join the service, you can view the service on Facebook Live or through Zoom, as we have been doing. If you prefer to view it through Zoom...make sure you are on our email list! Please let Pastor Dan know your email address if you aren’t getting his emails! Rain and Cold weather plan: On Sundays when it is raining or threatening to rain as well as when it will be too cold, we will continue to livestream our services from inside the sanctuary. An email will be sent

out that morning, so on those questionable days...be sure to check your email before coming for worship! *At this point, the bishop's office is recommending that we stick with the state recommendation of no more than 10 people indoors. As soon as that changes to permit larger gatherings, our worship team and church council have agreed on a plan to have 2 services to allow us to gather safely inside! More information will be coming when the time comes!*

From the Financial Secretary: As we begin the New Year, we wanted to let you know that our weekly Contribution target to support our Mission Plan is now **\$ 4,315**. For three weeks in January, we met only 50% of that goal. However, we did receive two full yearly pledges for 2021 and these contributions help us to come close to target for the month.

Overall, we received tithes and offerings from 49 families - 10 of whom used Bank Billpay and three used on-line Paypal. We highly recommend BillPay because your bank can send a check directly to the Church and your offering is automatically sent at monthly or weekly intervals - the frequency is up to you. Eleanor Lundy (elundy@elundy.org) can give you the Church's deposit account and routing numbers to help you get started using this method. We thank all of you who continue to support the mission of Kure Memorial Lutheran Church. We know that the Covid epidemic continues to strain many families financially and so we wish to remind you that we have the Covid Cares Fund to offer some financial assistance. Income TAX INFORMATION

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

Beginning on Monday, February 1, 2021, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Programs (VITA) at both the Senior Resource Center and Carolina Beach locations will resume serving the community with our free tax preparation. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we have implemented a process to minimize contact between taxpayers and VITA volunteers at each location, and are serving the public with a drop-off service only at the following locations:

Senior Resource Center: 2222 S College Road, Wilmington

Hours of Operation: Monday thru Friday by drop off appointment only

Appointments available between 9:00-11:00 am and 3:00-4:00 pm

To register for an appointment at this location, call 910-798-6416 (We will begin to return phone calls for appointments on January 25th and calls will be returned in the order they are received. Due to high call volume, calls will be returned within 24 to 48 hours.)

*Last available day for appointments is April 9, 2021

Carolina Beach Site: 300 Cape Fear Blvd, Carolina Beach

Hours of Operation: Monday thru Friday between 9:00-10:00 am and Saturday between 2:00-3:00 pm

This is a walk in drop-off site and form packets for this location are only available at this site. Below are a few key points to consider:

- We are only preparing 2020 taxes during the month of February.
- The Senior Resource Center is a drop off site by appointment only. To schedule a drop off appointment at that location, call the appointment line at **910-798-6416**. Calls will be returned in the order they are received.
- You will drop off all tax paperwork with required documentation, and will leave your information with us until your taxes have been completed. Taxpayers filing joint returns **must** both sign required documentation.
- You **MUST** bring photo identification (or copies) for each party filing the return, and **MUST** bring original Social Security cards, copies of Social Security cards or a Social Security Statement for all persons listed on the return, including dependents.
- Form packets may be picked up at any time outside the main entrance of the Senior Resource Center. **ALL** forms that require your signature(s) will be printed on yellow paper for your convenience.
- After drop off, a certified tax preparer will call you to verify your information and you will receive a few phone calls during the process to review your tax return.
- You will then return to the site to pick up your return and paperwork, and will be required to sign a consent for us to e-file your return.

For questions regarding tax preparation at either location, please call the Senior Resource Center at 910-798-6400. For Kure Memorial folks, Terry Hambel is also available to answer some of your Tax Questions. (910-769-1761)

Federal Point's Historical Society President's Letter September, 2019

Kure Memorial Lutheran Church Part V

June 26, 1955 members of the Church Council are pictured in front of the cross in the new church: L-R Oscar Wren, Merritt Foushee, Jason Lentz, Rev. David Johnson, Bob Ford, Lawrence C. Kure, Bob Hooker, Fred Schenk and Bill Williford. (The photo was taken by Bill Robertson, son in law of Lawrence Kure and then owner of the Kure Pier.) These men had not only planned and raised the funds for the new building but were also literally the driving force behind the construction and must have felt a great sense of pride on that dedication Sunday.

The church already had a Luther League for the youth and they sponsored a Boy Scout Troop. They also had a weekday church school on Tuesday afternoons, a Women of the Church group with 34 members and basketball teams for boys and girls that played the other church teams on the island. Rev. David Johnson left in 1956 and was replaced by Rev. William Johnson, Jr. who served until 1957. Rev. Corley Lineberger came next serving from 1957 till 1960.

In the 60s Kure Lutheran started a kindergarten that met weekday mornings during the public school year.

In 1962 they built a new Fellowship Hall and air conditioned the sanctuary. There was a fire in the nave in 1964 that burned the back set of arches and part of the roof that had to be repaired. Two years later they remodeled and air conditioned the parsonage.

Pastors during the 60s were Rev. Donald Loadholdt, 1961-62 and Rev. Ronald Weinelt, 1962-1970.


