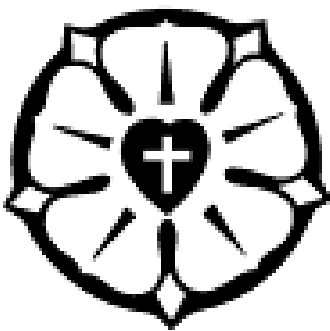

Lent begins Wednesday, February 22! It seems like just yesterday that we were decorating for Christmas! This year is already going by quickly! Surfin' on God's Grace!

FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY

When we voted last November to adopt our Mission Plan for 2023, we, as a Congregation, pledged to contribute an average of \$ 4654 each week in support of our Mission Plan. We reached that goal only one week this month. We hoped to receive Tithes and Offerings of \$ 23,272. Actual contributions were \$ 17,874 - giving us a deficit of \$ 5,398 for the month of January. 59 families contributed overall this month.

Our Rice Bowl collection to assist Carolina Beach Elementary School amounted to \$ 348. Also many families have committed to being part of the Polar Plunge and have contributed to that fund as well. We are always thankful for all of you who share your talents and resources in so many
