





## FROM PASTOR DAN

(Jesus said) "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)



Memorial Day has come and gone. Typically Memorial Day weekend is thought of as the beginning of summer! And for many people...summer seems to be a time where work slows down...it's a time of taking vacations ...going on trips...or maybe just taking time to go to the beach to play, to rest and to get rejuvenated! I remember last summer...occasionally on a Sunday afternoon after church, Chris and I would go down to the beach to just sit and relax and enjoy the sunshine, the people, the beach and the peaceful sound of the ocean. And it was so relaxing that most often...I would fall asleep! It felt like whatever burdens I had just disappeared...at least for a while. And I found rest for my soul. Those times were so precious and needed!

Jesus knew life was difficult. And to add to the normal difficulties of life, additional weariness and heavy burdens were imposed upon them by the Roman authority and Roman law. As well as having to live according to all of the human-made religious laws back then. So

Jesus was telling the people that living according to the love, comfort, compassion, grace, mercy and forgiveness of the kingdom of God, which he brought into the world...and feeling his presence in their lives...that through all of that...he would give them rest.

In our own day, there are many things that can make us weary...and feel the heavy burdens that we carry. Sometimes those are in the form of the guilt we might have of the sinful things we've done...or maybe it's our health...or financial struggles...or maybe difficulties with our jobs...or family challenges. You can probably name lots of different things that make you weary...or add to the burdens that you carry.

Jesus says, "Come to me...weary and burdened...and I will give you rest!" In other words, "I will remind you of my love for you...and that I am always with you...helping you...guiding you...forgiving you...strengthening you...reminding you that with me, all things are possible. So, rest in my presence!"

And...admittedly...that might be hard to do sometimes. But I invite you to pause and to let Jesus work in your life to give you rest from your weariness...from the burdens that weigh you down...to remind you that he is with you to guide and comfort and nurture and strengthen you for whatever lies ahead.



**Book Club:** We will meet on **Monday June 19<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 PM** in the Fellowship Hall to discuss *The Great Believers* by Rebecca Makkai. Everyone is welcome and there are extra copies of the book in the office. Please let Lynn know if you borrow a "guest" copy. Join us for fellowship, food and a usually interesting discussion.

"The Great Believers is a page turner about illness and mortality. The novel tells, in alternating chapters, about a group of friends, most of them gay men, in Chicago in the mid-to-late 1980s, and about a woman in 2015 who has gone to Paris in search of her estranged daughter. Both halves of the narrative are about senseless loss and the efforts to survive and, if possible, redress that loss. Both are about love's power and love's limitations.

The Great Believers is peppered with surprises, a minor wonder in a narrative so rife with dreadfully foregone conclusions. As is true of many good novels, writing about it requires considerable navigation around spoilers. Suffice it to say that in the mid-80s sections the grim reaper runs rampant, but there's no telling who'll be felled and who'll be spared. The 2015 sections are, in their way, a detective story. How, after all, does a mother locate her adult daughter, knowing only that she's somewhere in Paris?" (NYT Review)

Helping Hands @ KMLC: In 2019, the Service Team formed a group to assist members of the Congregation who needed help with everyday activities. Sometimes people needed a ride, to go shopping or to the doctor; sometimes a meal or help with laundry was needed; sometimes something unexpected came up and people didn't know who to call. # My Father and Myself Facing the Sun BY LAWSON FUSAO INADA

We are both strong, dark, bright men, though perhaps you might not notice, finding two figures flat against the landscape like the shadowed backs of mountains.

Which would not be far from wrong, for though we both have on Western clothes

and he is seated on a yellow spool of emptied and forgotten telephone cable and I recline on a green aluminum lounge,

we are both facing into the August sun as august as Hiroshima and the autumn.

There are differences, however, if you care to discover, coming close, respectfully. You must discover the landscape as you go.

Come. It is in the eyes, the face, the way we would greet you stumbling as you arrive. He is much the smooth, grass-brown slopes reaching knee-high around you as you walk;

I am the cracks of cliffs and gullies, pieces of secret deep in the back of the eye.

But he is still my father, and I his son.

After a while, there is time to go fishing, both of us squatting on rocks in the dusk, leaving peaks and tree line responsible for light.

There is a lake below, which both of us acknowledge, by facing, forward, like the sun.

Ripples of fish, moon, luminous insects. Frogs, owls, crickets at their sound. Deer, raccoon, badger come down to drink.

At the water's edge, the children are fishing, casting shadows from the enormous shoreline. Everything functions in the function of summer.

And gradually, and not by chance, the action stops, the children hush back among rocks and also watch, with nothing to capture but dusk.

There are four of us, together among others.

And I am not at all certain what all this means, if it means anything, but feel with all my being that I must write this down, if I write anything.

My father, his son, his grandsons, strong, serene.

Night, night, night, before the following morning.

## About the poet, Lawson Fusao Inada ...

Lawson Fusao Inada was born in 1938 in Fresno, California, a third-generation Japanese American. His grandparents founded the Fresno Fish Market, his father was a dentist, and his mother was a teacher. In 1942, Inada and his family were sent to internment camps, first in Fresno, then in Arkansas and Colorado; he was one of the youngest to live in the camps. He studied poetry and jazz at Fresno State University. His first collection of poetry "Before the War: Poems as they happened" was published in 1971. Inada edited the anthology *Only What We Carry: The Japanese Internment Experience* (2000), a major contribution to the record of the Japanese American experience. Inada was appointed Oregon poet laureate in 2006. His awards include a Guggenheim Fellowship, fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, and a Creative Arts Grant from the Civil Liberties Public Education Fund. One of his poems is inscribed on a stone at the Japanese American Historical Plaza in Portland, Oregon.

Give us eyes to see and ears to hear Your will and leading. Amen.




# My Summer Prayer
