A few weeks ago, we were wandering through the street market that takes place on Dock Street in Wilmington on a Saturday mornings, checking out all of the artisans who were displaying their artwork and the goodies that they make.

The artwork of one of the women displaying her craft, really caught my eye. Most of her artwork was repurposed broken seashells, which she used to create beautiful works of art! You may have seen things like this yourselves. It reminded me of the artists who create beautiful works of art from pieces of broken glass. We have a couple of folks in our church who create some beautiful pieces of art and jewelry repurposing broken glass!

It's remarkable to me, to see the creativity, the passion, the desire that these folks have for taking something that probably most of us wouldn't even give a second thought to...and create something so eye-catching and beautiful!

And all of this got me thinking about us...as God's children. Think about it...we can have so many issues going on in our lives! Life can be difficult...challenging...overwhelming. And we may not handle the stress of life particularly well. We may say and do things that hurt others, that we realize we shouldn't have said or done! We are broken people...in need of forgiveness and of being made new each and every day! And the wonderful thing is...the redemption we receive through what Jesus has done for us makes broken people like us...beautiful in God's eyes. In other words, God takes the brokenness of our lives and makes us beautiful...kind of like the broken seashell art...and the broken glass art!

There is a great song by a Christian artist named Mark Schultz called "Broken and Beautiful" that speaks to this. Part of the lyrics go like this:

It's beautiful, Beautiful
Come as you are, Surrender your heart
Broken and beautiful*

UPDATE FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

The 2023 ALCM conference in Philadelphia was a week I did not want to end! The kickoff to the conference titled, “What Wondrous Love,” began with a welcome from composer and musician, Mark Miller. What a joy it was to listen to this man speak! We sang What Wondrous Love in a round (we need to try this soon), and all I could think of was telling Pastor Dan about it, because we all know he LOVES rounds! There was one workshop that day, and I chose Percussion Techniques with John Sall who serves at Abington Presbyterian Church near Philadelphia. After that, I attended a choral reading session where a bunch of us checked out new choir anthems by different publishers. This was SO cool! Being in a room full of professional musicians, the music sounded well rehearsed even though we were seeing it for the first time. That evening, the first day came to a close with a service at Christ Church where William Penn was baptized and Ben Franklin and his wife are buried in the cemetery on the grounds.

The second day started off with a morning prayer service at Church of the Holy Trinity (next to Rittenhouse Square, 1857). The two workshops I attended that day were a Piano Repertoire Session with Anne Krentz Organ exploring new piano music for preludes and postludes and Giving Voice to Verse with Tom Trenney, an amazing composer whose award winning choir anthem was featured at the first night’s service. We were bussed to Philadelphia Episcopal Cathedral that evening for dinner followed by a beautiful Choral Arts concert featuring music found in an old Italian library that had never been performed before. Wow!

The third day, we had morning worship with Omaldo Perez and friends which included drums, saxophone, and trumpet. We were moving and dancing to Omaldo’s jazzy and latin inspired hymn arrangements. It was the perfect beginning to the day! This was followed by the morning meeting led by Rev. Dien Ashley Taylor and his music leader Jean Boehler of Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church (The Bronx, New York). He is a riot! I was lucky enough to sit next to them at lunch the day before. I told him and Jean afterwards there should be a “Dien Taylor Button” loaded up with all his funny sayings! Haha! Workshops that day were All Creation Sings: Introducing the Supplement to Evangelical Lutheran Worship with John Weit and African American Spirituals and Music of Black Composers in Congregational Singing with Jay Fluellen. All Creation Sings is the new hymnal we are now using for services. We had dinner on our own this night. My friend Bonnie and I ran over to the amazing Reading Market and were lucky enough to catch a performance of the famous Wanamaker Organ in Macy’s on the way back to the hotel! The day was complete after a Festival of Hymns in the Church of the Holy Trinity.

Saturday, the last day of the conference, buses left early for Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Lansdale, PA where we had our last workshop and service. Talk about saving the best for last, my workshop was Improvisation: Drawing from Many Streams: Musical Styles in Today’s Hymnody with the great Omaldo Perez! What an inspiration this man is!!! He is incredible! We got many ideas for playing hymns in different styles. Next, we attended the Sending Eucharist, including participants in the children’s choir camp led by Michael Burkhardt, director of worship and music at St. John Lutheran Church (Farmington Hills, Michigan). And then it was finished.

I have so much to reflect on after Philadelphia 2023. These conferences are crucial for professional development and fellowship with other church musicians. It is inspiring and creates a very important pathway for both personal and professional growth. I have made so many important connections and friends with these experiences. Thank you so much for making it possible for me to attend these conferences! They are a true blessing! Next stop, the ALCM conference at Duke University 2025!

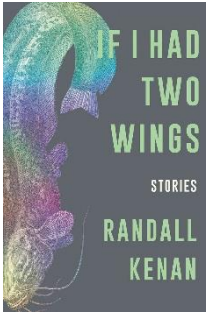

We are Your people created in Your likeness. Please do not ever desert us, even if we deserve it.

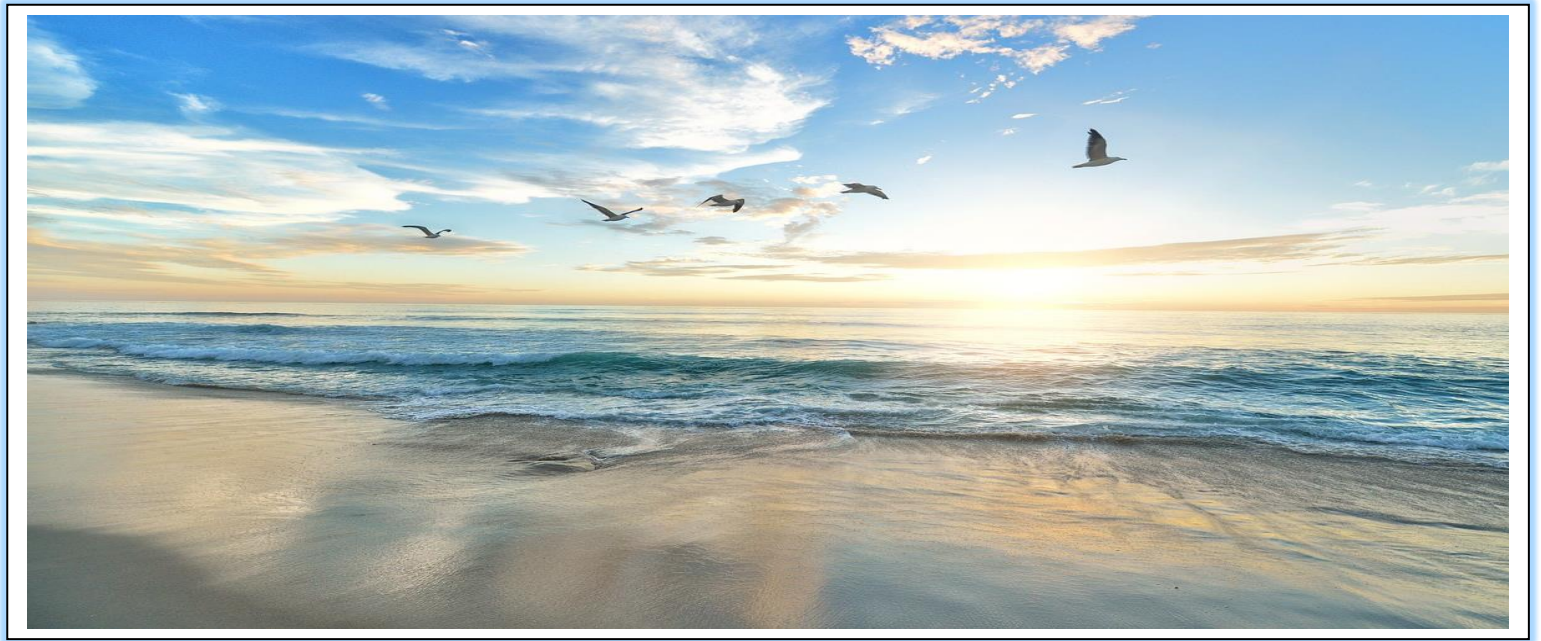
Let us remember that everyone we meet is that neighbor we should treat
