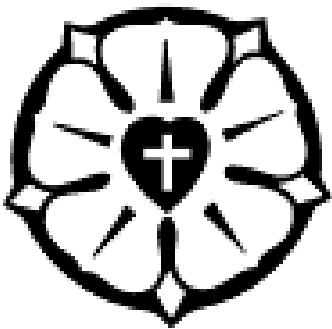

Thanks to everyone who helped make August another good month contributions-wise. Sixty-two families contributed Tithes and Offerings this month. (The weekly number of contributors ranged from 16 to 30 families) The number of families contributing automatic tithe payments through their banks continues to increase. This definitely helps keep our budget on an even keel. The amount needed to support our Mission Plan for August was \$ 18,618. Actual Tithes and Offerings for August were \$ 19,660 - giving us a small surplus. Our Rice Bowl Offering designated for KMLC's pre-school amounted to \$ 501.50. 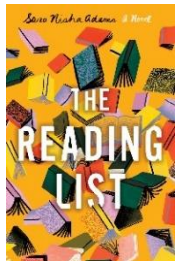

I Want to Write by Margaret Walker

I want to Write
I want to write
I want to write
the songs of my people.
I want to hear them
singing melodies in the dark.
I want to catch the last floating strains
from their sob-torn throats.
I want to frame their dreams
into words;
their souls into notes.
I want to catch their sunshine laughter in a bowl;
fling dark hands to a darker sky
and fill them full of stars
then crush and mix such lights till they become
a mirrored pool of brilliance in the dawn.

*A key figure in Chicago's African American movement, Margaret Walker was born in Alabama in 1915. Her father was a minister who made sure that his daughter learned about philosophy and ingrained in her a love of poetry from a very early age. She graduated from Northwestern University in 1935 and began working at the Federal Writer's Project. In 1942 Walker published the poetry collection *For My People* which won the highly regarded Yale Younger Poets Award. She was one of the first African American writers to win such an award and also one of the youngest ever to be published. Over her lifetime, Walker collected no less than 6 honorary degrees and fellowships as well as a life time achievement award from the state of Mississippi. Her collection *This is My Century* in 1979 is typical of her control of language to create vibrant images. In 1998, at the age of 73, Margaret Walker died in Chicago. Though her canon of work is perhaps a little smaller than other poets of the same era, she has been, and still is, an influence for many Black American and women writers.*

We remember those who work in the night.

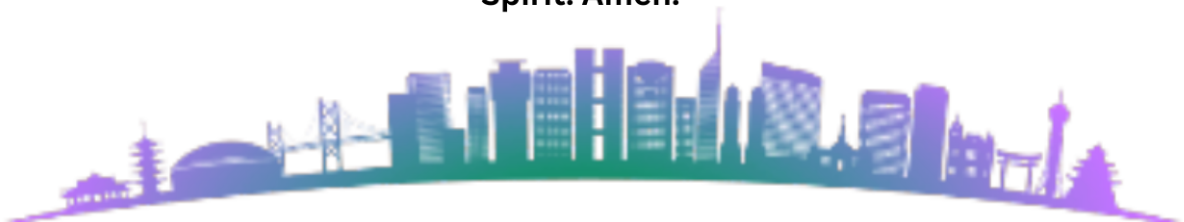
We remember those who are trying to recover from their labor and toils of the day.
