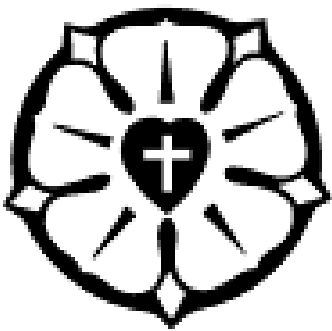

In 2007, when I was finishing seminary and getting ready to move on to my first call as a pastor; Pastor Tom, the pastor I had been serving with in family ministry for the previous 7 or 8 years, gave this mug to me as a gift. He told me that it was "used", and that it had been given to him many years before, from one of his parishioners with this message: "This is to remind you that you are not Superman...and you can't do it all. And the "S" is also to remind you that you are both "saint" and "sinner" at the same time."

Pastor Tom gave this coffee mug to me with the same message. And that message has been a good reminder for me ever since...that I can't do it all...that's why everything you all do to facilitate the ministry we share is so important and life-giving!

It is also a good reminder for all of you...that you aren't Supermen/Superwomen either, no matter how hard you may try! Neither can you do it all. We need each other because God created us to work together and support each other and care for each other!

But the more I think about it... I think there's even more to it than that. I think it is also a reminder that we need the presence of God in our lives, the "Advocate" as we read in John's gospel... to guide us, strengthen us, inspire us and help us in all that we do. Because this journey we call life, can be a struggle. It can be challenging, and we may feel alone at times. But with God's presence we can feel more confident in overcoming the challenges we see before us...knowing that we aren't alone to face them on our own, as well as tackling those things that God places on our hearts as we live out our faith. Faithful Fun Friday to be held on April 12th.

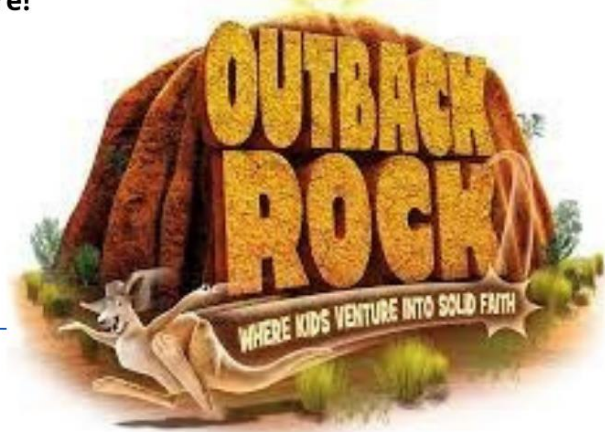

April Birthday Sunday...will be on Sunday, April 7th...following worship! We hope you will join in celebrating everyone with a March Birthday!

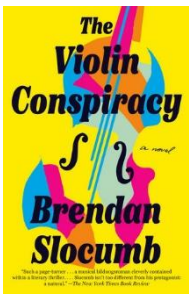
