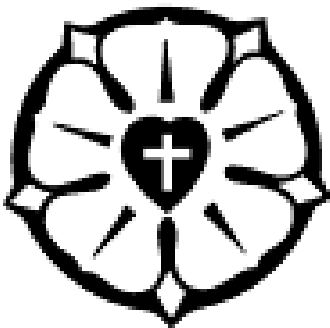

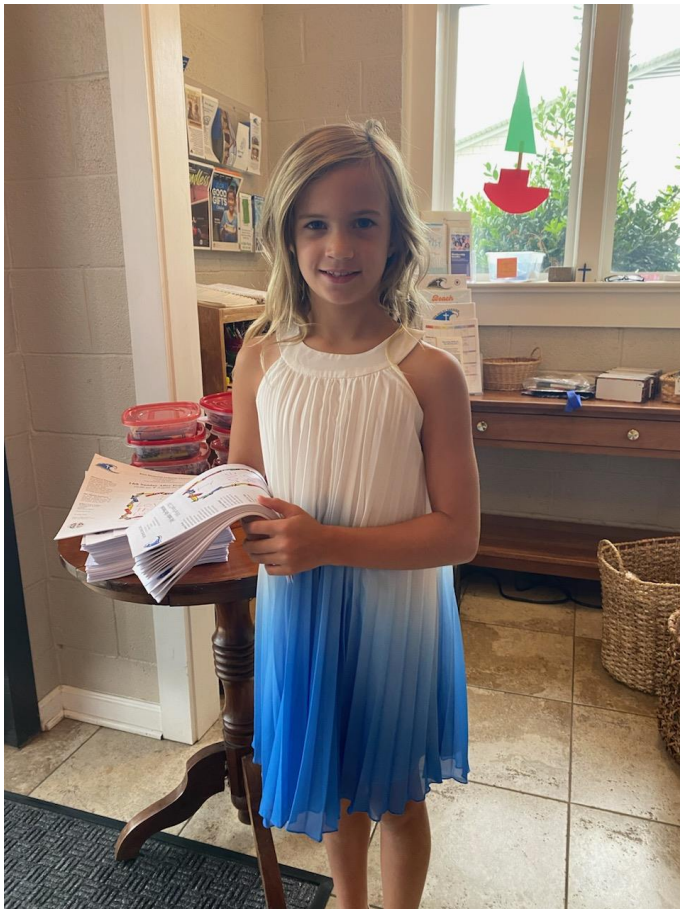
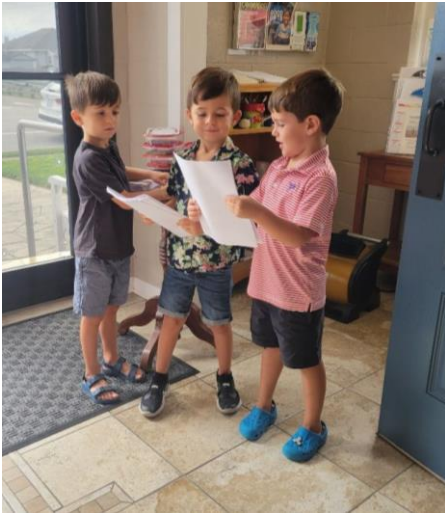

## From Pastor Dan

*(Jesus said) "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away." (Luke 21:33)*



Many of you may remember the TV series, "MASH" from the 1970s and 1980s! It was, and continues to be, one of my favorite shows to watch. Thank goodness for livestreaming technology! There is one episode I've been thinking about recently, which begins with all of the characters gathered in the mess tent celebrating New Years Eve, and it concludes with all the characters gathering in the mess hall celebrating New Years Eve the next year. And the rest of the episode shows glimpses of things that went on during the various seasons of that particular year. So you see the entire year pass by in a 25 minute episode!

Well...can you believe it's September already! Winter and spring have come and gone. Summer vacation bible school is behind us. Our summer mission trip...which several of us were so excited about...was 2 months ago already! Students and school staff are back in school beginning a new school year. The beaches are getting less and less crowded as the summer tourist season has come to an end. There is only one month left of our summer beach services. And we are already thinking about and plan for our Advent and Christmas worship schedules!

Thinking about how quickly this past year has gone...it reminded me of that MASH episode where the entire year went by in 25 minutes! It almost seems like that's how fast 2024 has gone!

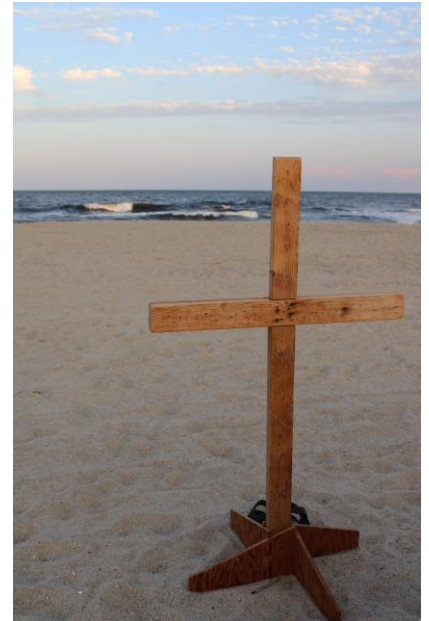

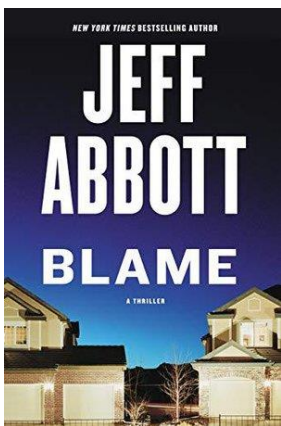

- Education - Carousel Child Advocacy Center offers a variety of opportunities to learn more about child abuse in our community. How to recognize it and how to report it. Schedule a workshop or take a tour of one of our three Child Advocacy Centers located in Brunswick, New Hanover, and Pender counties. Call 910-254-9898 to schedule a workshop or a tour.
- Advocacy - Carousel Child Advocacy Center is called to aid child survivors of abuse and neglect, and their families in the everyday work that we do, whether it is through victim support, medical services and forensic interviews, therapeutic services, case management, or a host of other activities that ensure that children who are survivors of abuse can heal, recover, thrive, and shine.
- Prevention - The cornerstone of Partners in Prevention is to educate people how to make sure that children are in safe, nurturing environments. The program is designed to minimize the opportunities for abuse, promote healthy child development, and implement strategies to prevent child sexual abuse and exploitation.

## Two Poems to Share with School-aged Children

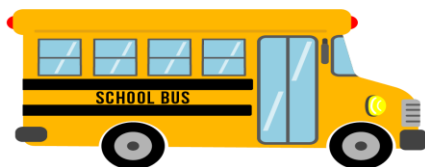
*Where I'm from ....* By George Ella Lyon

As our region's largest homeless services provider, Good Shepherd meets hundreds of neighbors in crisis each year, including families with small children, adults with disabilities, seniors, Veterans, and those who are unsheltered. Open 24/7, our programs offer a variety of wraparound services ranging from a free on-site Medical Clinic to a Soup Kitchen to laundry facilities, so that these neighbors can have all of their needs met in one safe and welcoming place. Our team of Case Managers work with each individual or family we meet to help them identify and overcome the challenges that have caused their homelessness and assist with their housing search by developing an individualized housing plan, offering transportation to apartment viewings, and providing security deposits and first and last months' rent when needed. Our Housing Retention program ensures that newly rehoused households remain successfully housed for the long term.
